The Third Year Bursary is established as a bursary to assist James Cook University students who reside at The John Flynn College. In 2027 through a single Bursary valued up to \$2,960.

The Third-Year Bursary recognises a second-year resident who balances part-time employment with their studies while consistently living out the values of John Flynn College. It supports a returning student who has contributed to College life and intends to keep doing so in their third year.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Third Year Bursary, an applicant must:

1. Be a current second-year resident at The John Flynn College, returning for a third year of residency.
2. Be enrolled full-time in a recognised course of study and returning as a full-time student.
3. Hold ongoing part-time paid employment while studying.
4. Have consistently lived out the values of The John Flynn College throughout your time as a resident

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications must be submitted on the official form no later than the advertised closing date. Applicants must attach to the official form:

- A personal statement of 300-500 words including specific examples of displaying the College Values.
- A statement of future contribution of 150-200 words outlining your intention to contribute to the Flynn Community in your third year.
- Employer Letter confirming a minimum of six months' employment
- Employer reference speaking to your reliability, work ethic and character
- A personal reference from a person other than a family member, who can speak to the applicants character and conduct.
- Scholarship applications must be emailed to JohnFlynnCollege@jcu.edu.au by the due date

SELECTION PROCESS

The applications will be assessed against the following:

1. Sustained part-time employment. Demonstrated commitment to holding down part-time/casual work alongside full-time study, supported by an employer letter confirming a minimum of six months' employment.
2. Demonstrated College values. Clear, specific examples of how the applicant has displayed and upheld the values of John Flynn College during their time as a resident.
3. Contribution to College life. Evidence of active participation in and contribution to the Flynn community.
4. Strength of references. The quality of the employer and personal references in attesting to the applicant's character, reliability, and conduct.
5. Future contribution. The strength of the applicant's stated intentions for contributing to the Flynn community in their third year.

CONDITIONS OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

Payment will be made by crediting the recipient's John Flynn College account.

The bursary is awarded as a \$2,500 credit toward third-year residential fees and includes a waiver of the re-application fee. You will initially be asked to pay the re application fee, however if successful in receiving the application, this fee will be credited to your account.

The recipient must maintain full-time enrolment in third year; the bursary may be withdrawn if these conditions are not met.

A scholarship may be terminated by the College Principal if the recipient:

- Fails to confirm acceptance of the scholarship within 7 days of being notified of the scholarship; or
- Ceases to meet the eligibility criteria; or
- Is suspended or excluded from their course of study; or
- Is suspended or excluded from residency at The John Flynn College
- Is found to have provided false or misleading information in relation to the scholarship

A recipient cannot defer or request suspension of their scholarship payments.

A recipient cannot be the recipient of more than one scholarship issued by The John Flynn College.
